Draíocht provides a range of opportunities for children and young people to engage in, based on the belief that all of us, no matter how small, are entitled to access to arts and cultural experiences.

DRAÍOCHT - VISUAL ARTS & ARTIST RESIDENCIES

Opened in November 2018 by Fergus Finlay, former CEO of Barnardos, and exhibiting until 23 February 2019, is 'Mulhuddart Satellite', an exhibition by our Artist in Residence Michael McLoughlin (pgs 30-31). The artwork and accompanying engagement programme reflects the lived experience of people, groups, clubs and agencies who make Mulhuddart the community it is. Opening on 14 March is 'MAKing Art: PAINTing' featuring work by Susan Connolly, Bridget Flannery, Geraldine O'Neill & Liz Rackard in our Ground Floor Gallery and Paintings from the Collection of The Arts Council in our First Floor Gallery (pg 32). Draíocht continues it's INCUBATE studio residency programme for emerging/early-career visual artists, with an Open Call for a six week Studio Residency (pg 33). And we welcome Ceol Connected as Theatre Company in Residence for 2019 (pg 46). Draíocht's two gallery spaces are free to visit and open Monday to Saturday 10am-6pm.


DRAÍOCHT - PERFORMANCE PROGRAMME





Mulhuddart Satellite Michael McLoughlin

Mulhuddart Satellite is a major exhibition by Michael McLoughlin, at the mid-point of his 3 year residency (2017 to 2019) in Mulhuddart, a community on the doorstep of Draíocht. The exhibition presents a number of mappings of Mulhuddart through drawings, soundscape, audio recordings and radio broadcasts.

The artwork and accompanying engagement programme reflects the lived experience of people, groups, clubs and agencies who make Mulhuddart the community it is.

Mulhuddart Satellite and the longer term relationship with Mulhuddart through McLoughlin's residency, exemplifies Draíocht's local participation focus in its new 2018-2022 Strategy - 'Space For The Arts' and the community involvement central to the work of Mulhuddart Priority Task Group and the recently published Mulhuddart Strategic Development and Implementation Plan.

Mulhuddart has been a prominent west Dublin civil parish for hundreds of years. Along with Clonsilla and Castleknock it was one of the main three areas of what is now Dublin 15. With this exhibition we aim to present visons of Mulhuddart as presented by clubs, community networks and groups of friends who help define this continually developing vibrant area.

McLoughlin has been Artist in Residence in Draíocht since 2017. The role we asked Michael to take on was that of 'diviner' (coined by Sharon Murphy) to spend time in Mulhuddart developing an understanding of the communities within it and in turn begin to suggest possible linkages between Draíocht, Mulhuddart residents and the participations that could build potential points of connection.

The Mulhuddart Satellite exhibition presents a number of 'mappings' of Mulhuddart, each presented as an installation in the gallery, drawings, or as public radio broadcasts. One piece for instance consists of a bank of wall mounted loudspeaker cones and was made from McLoughlin's door to door calls to every home in Mulhuddart, in an attempt to record the names of every resident. Another draws on local archaeology and changes in what Mulhuddart is, several over centuries.

In the main gallery an installation that takes the name of the exhibition 'Mulhuddart Satellite' features spatial recordings of conversations between community groups in Mulhuddart and is made from banks of speakers hanging from the gallery ceiling through which the audience negotiate their way through conversation, chat and stories.

Overall the exhibition explores place, belonging, friendships and the connections we have to the people around us. This sense of place is something we can't take for granted and exhibitions like Mulhuddart Satellite can act as a gentle reminder of how our relationships with neighbours, friends and family define us and the place we live.

Mulhuddart Satellite Radio Collaboration with 92.5 Phoenix FM

As part of the Mulhuddart Satellite exhibition programme we will be collaborating with 92.5 Phoenix FM to broadcast live from Draíocht's Artist Studio. Phoenix FM is a Community Radio station which reflects the special interests and needs of the listenership of the Dublin 15 community that the Station is licensed to serve. For four Thursday mornings commencing January 31st, from 10am to 12 noon, the D15 Today show will take the name Mulhuddart Satellite, broadcasting stories, ideas and discussions relating to Mulhuddart. Presented by D15 Today's Jeff Murphy and Charlie Kurtz, the show will entertain and provoke further conversation relating to the exhibition and the Mulhuddart area over the course of the month. Join us live in Draíocht, or tune to 92.5 Phoenix FM on January 31st, February 7th, 14th & 21st.

The second element is a sound installation, made from names of students in Riversdale, recorded by McLoughlin in October 2018 which form part of the 'Whats in a name?' Speaker array in the Mulhuddart Satellite exhibition.

Draíocht & Fishamble: The New Play Company A PLAY FOR IRELAND

Throughout 2019, Draíocht continues our collaboration with Fishamble: The New Play Company and 5 other venues across the island of Ireland on 'A PLAY FOR IRELAND' (2017-2019), a major new playwriting initiative, supported by Tesco Finest. This initiative supports new writing and encourages the citizens of Ireland and non-Irish citizens living on the island of Ireland, to write plays, engaging people from all communities throughout the country. Fishamble's A PLAY FOR IRELAND is the search for an idea for one, big, ambitious play that captures the zeitgeist of the country.

2019 begins with 30 brand new finished scripts being submitted to the programme, which have been developed during 2018 with the support of dramaturgs, directors and designers from around the country. In Phase 2 of this programme, 6 plays will be shortlisted and, later in 2019, one play will be commissioned and receive a full production and national tour, including at Drafocht!

Draíocht is delighted to be supporting the writers, Catríona Daly, Jeda De Brí and Finbarr Doyle, Alice Murphy, Barry McStay and Ian Toner who, over the last year, have been participating in group and one to one workshops and mentorship, and have now submitted drafts of their new plays. Fishamble is humbled and delighted by the standard of work received from all the participating playwrights.

'Draíocht is delighted to be working in a developmental way with our colleagues in Fishamble on the A Play For Ireland Project. This two year ambitious project has been supporting writers in a considered way through mentoring and peer support at its core, as well as providing audiences with the opportunity to see a fully produced piece that will reflect and interrogate contemporary Ireland. Draíocht's Network Collaborations Venue Networks and Partnerships

Draíocht is an active member of two venue networks.

ShortWorks is a four member Network that focuses on multidisciplinary work for children from 0 to 12 years. 2019 will see Fidget Feet's new show 'Hatch', developed with support from ShortWorks in 2018, embark on a national tour in 2019 (see page 28). 2019 will also see ShortWorks announce a Development Bursary (awarded through an Open Call process) to enable a practitioner develop a new piece for children.

Strollers is a 10 venue nationwide venue Network. An annual Production Award is granted to a company or artist to assist in the making and touring of work. The application process for the 2019 Production Award took place in the Summer of 2018 with the award going to Joanne Ryan to support a remount and tour of her show 'Eggsistentialism'. This piece will tour to all Stroller venues in Autumn 2019 and will be here in Draíocht in November 2019.

Draíocht, Civic Theatre and Mermaid Arts Centre came together in 2018 to support an 18 month long programme of work by Early Years Theatre Artist, Anna Newell. Funded by The Arts Council, 'Baby's First Xmas' and 'Little Tiny Xmas' were the first productions (December 2018) supported by this partnership. 2019 will see the development and tour of a new show 'BigKidLittleKid', a non verbal show for 3 to 6 year olds as well as tours of extant work e.g. 'Sing Me To The Sea', a show designed for children up to 12 years with complex needs. 'Sing Me To The Sea' was originally funded by Wicklow County Arts Office with design funded by Riverbank Arts Centre, in consultation with Mid Kildare Network Disability Team and St Catherine's School, Newcastle, County Wicklow.



OUR PLACE, OUR STORIES

OUR PLACE, OUR STORIES is a project which facilitates a collaboration between 6 leading artists and 6 key communities in Dublin 15, under the artistic directorship of Veronica Coburn (Hallelujah!, Draíocht's Community Clown Choir, Home Theatre (Ireland) project).

Supported as part of the Creative Ireland Programme's National Creativity Fund, with additional funding being provided by Fingal County Council, this project will take place in 2019, culminating on Culture Night with the participating groups presenting their pieces to a local audience.

Each group will have 15-20 participants, will work through a variety of performing art forms and each will focus on a different community of place or interest. Because of the young demographic of Dublin 15 and Draíocht's subsequent commitment to this age group, two groups will be made up of young people (14yrs +). Each group will explore what stories they need and want to tell and how those stories can be told to ensure they achieve their full potential when they meet their audiences in their communites and in Draíocht.

OUR PLACE, OUR STORIES, is about facilitating people in an exploration of themes that are relevant to them, to recognise their uniqueness, their shared experiences and to see their community in a way they wouldn't have done before. It is about recognising our truths and celebrating the positives.
