
Leaving Cert Art Appreciation

ARTIST IN RESIDENCE

Selena Quilligan

February/March 2026

In mid-February, we welcome Selena Quilligan to our Artists Studio. Selena's work is maximalist and draws inspiration from nostalgia and girlhood to explore the bittersweetness of memory and the vivification of 2D objects.

"The subjects in my work are all people close to me, but I am often the main subject matter. I take the inspiration for the paintings I make from my own life. I try to make everyday, banal activities look more exciting and fun. I explore a variety of materials including screen print, drawings, sewing, and sculpture. My practice utilises the fast pace of mediums like oil pastels and expanding foam.



There is a sense of immediacy and childlike mark making that is used in my work. I also use acrylic paint, ink, glitter, canvas, and stickers. I create *Sel's World* by putting my memories and my life through *Sel's Filter*, which transforms these everyday activities into funky paintings. In *Sel's World* the proportions and scale are more eccentric."

"The Toddler Take Over has always been a magical and creatively productive time for me, ever since we invented the first one 11 years ago. materials, spaces and playfully gathering people to put things in motion. Draíocht is aptly named; it's just magic to be a part of it!"
